FORTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE MANAGERS
TO THE SUBSCRIBERS

For the Year ended 31st December, 1944

The Managers have pleasure in submitting their 48th Annual Report to the Subscribers, and are glad to be able to make a fairly satisfactory report on the working of the Hospital for the past year, although expenditure has again been exceptionally heavy.

The Managers have again to express their deep appreciation and thanks to the Subscribers and Contributors who have so generously supported the Hospital.

Sincere thanks are also due to the Collectors throughout Lewis and Harris for their unfailing assistance in sending in house-to-house collections.

"SOUTH HARRIS BED"

During the year under review, the people of South Harris made a determined effort and raised a sum of £500 to name a bed in the Lewis Hospital the "South Harris Bed," and the Managers extend their congratulations to the South-Harris people for this magnificent effort.

The Managers record with regret the death of Mr Roderick Murray, Port of Ness, for many years the representative for the Ness District on the Board of Managers. During his long connection with the Management Committee, Mr Murray rendered valuable service to the community.

MEDICAL REPORT

The Managers wish to thank the Surgeon, House Surgeon, Matron and Members of the Nursing Staff for their loyal and efficient service to patients and visitors.

The year has been a strenuous one and each Ward has been working to capacity.

The Matron is experiencing considerable difficulty in getting sufficient Nursing Staff owing to the lack of accommodation for extra Nurses necessitated by the shorter working hours and extra off-duty laid down by the Taylor Plan. The time has now come when it is necessary to secure larger accommodation for the Nursing Staff.

The Managers take this opportunity of thanking Doctors C. B. Macleod, A. MacPhail, R. M. Fraser and A. Matheson for their services as Honorary Visiting Physicians and as Anaesthetists; also Dr Steven for his services as Anaesthetist.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The year opened with a credit balance of £6310 8/-. The total Income for the year to 31st December, 1944, amounted to £10,731 6s 1d, and the total expenditure to £12,048 2s 7d, shewing an increase of expenditure over income of £1316 16s 6d.

Contributions from Patients have increased during the year and Donations and Subscriptions have been well-maintained.

ELECTION OF MANAGERS

The following Managers automatically retire in terms of the Constitution, viz.:—Mrs Murdo Maclean, Rev. I. Carmichael, Dr D. A. Maclennan, Mr James MacDonald, Mr Murdo Macleod, but all are eligible for re-election.

During the year Dr C. B. Macleod resigned from the Board of Managers. It will now be necessary to appoint a Manager in place of Dr Macleod.

SURGEON'S ANNUAL REPORT

A study of the accompanying statistical table shows that the total amount of work carried out in all departments remains more or less constant for the past three years. One, therefore, concludes that, with the present available accommodation, the Hospital is working to full capacity. This is substantiated by the fact that more patients are waiting admission than in previous years.

During the year under review admissions numbered 811, of which only 39 come under the Emergency Medical Services Scheme. 803 operations were performed.

A total of 1948 patients attended for out-patient consultation, of whom a record number of 882 presented themselves for the first time.

The volume of work in the X-Ray Department continues to be heavy and has already reached a stage justifying the employment of a full-time technician. Unfortunately, however, a technician is not readily obtainable under War conditions, and the burden has necessarily fallen to the lot of the existing staff.

The work of the Maternity Department continues to progress satisfactorily. 59 patients were admitted during the year and 41 births were recorded.

Since the appointment of the local practitioners as Honorary Visiting Physicians in November, 1942, all medical cases have come under their care. Under this arrangement each local practitioner now assumes responsibility for his own medical cases in Hospital and also for those recommended to him by any country practitioner.

The efforts made to establish a local Voluntary Blood Transfusion Service as a branch of the Scottish National Blood Transfusion Service have met with considerable success. 170 voluntary donors are at present available, but it must be emphasised that a continued steady supply of volunteers is essential in order that this service may be maintained.

The Hospital has been fortunate in obtaining a supply of Penicillin for specially selected cases requiring this modern method of treatment and very gratifying results have so far been obtained.

Despite the difficulties encountered in obtaining both Nursing and Domestic Staff, it has so far not been necessary to close down any of the Wards.

In conclusion I record my appreciation of the services rendere 1 in their capacity as Anæsthetists by Doctors C. B. MacLeod, P. MacPhail, A. Matheson and R. M. Fraser, and likewise pay tribute to Miss Margaret Ross, Deputy Matron, and members of the Nursing Staff, for their constant effort in maintaining a high standard of efficiency in the running of the Hospital.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

FOR ADMISSION OF PATIENTS

As amended by Resolution passed at the Annual Meeting of Subscribers held on 24th March, 1932, and approved by the Department of Health for Scotland on 27th January, 1932.

I. The Surgeon-Consultant for the time being shall act as Superintendent of the Hospital.

II. The existing Regulations with reference to the admission, treatment, and conduct of Patients while in Hospital are rescinded and the following substituted:—

- 1. The Superintendent of the Hospital shall regulate the admission of Patients.
- 2. Patients for whose treatment Local Authorities are responsible will be admitted on the certification of the Authority's Medical Officer of Health.
- 3. Except in cases of accident or sudden emergency, application for admission of private individuals must be made (on prescribed form) by, or with the express consent of, the patient's usual Medical Attendant.
- 4. In cases of accident or sudden emergency, the Superintendent may authorise instant admission, without reference to any Private Medical Practitioner.
- 5. Patients suffering from such acute febrile infections or such other physical or mental diseases as cannot properly be treated in a general hospital will not be admitted; and cases of chronic diseases of long standing, or of incurable diseases, will be admitted only under special circumstances.
- 6. All treatment in surgical cases will be provided by the Surgeon-Superintendent. In medical cases treatment will be provided by the patient's own medical attendant or his nominee, such nomination to be intimated on admission to the Superintendent.
- 7. In cases for whose treatment the Surgeon has assumed responsibility he shall afford to the patient's usual Medical Attendant every facility for collaborating with him in the treatment of the case.

8. So far as Consultations at the Hospital are concerned, the Surgeon will confine himself to those cases which are surgical, and all such consultations must be with the consent of the patient's own Medical Attendant.

9. No charge will be made for Surgical or Medical treatment provided at the Hospital except in cases sent in by Local Authorities and patients

from foreign ships.

10. The Fees payable to the Surgeon in respect of patients for whose treatment a Local Authority is liable shall be arranged between the Managers, the Surgeon, and the Local Authority concerned.

- 11. (1) It shall be the duty of the Surgeon in co-operation with the Managers to arrange for the services of the Anæsthetist where such is required in connection with any case treated by him, and, when necessary, for a Practitioner to assist him at his operation.
 - (2) A Fee of 10/6 shall be payable by the Managers to an Anæsthetist employed by the Surgeon.
- 12. (1) Normally no charge will be made for maintenance while in Hospital, but in exceptional cases, where the Managers are satisfied as to ability to pay, a charge not exceeding £3 per week may be made, and in Surgical cases a charge may also be made to cover the cost of dressings. One-half of the maternity benefit obtained by insured patients and the wives of insured men must be paid to the Hospital.

Note.—Payment of any charges made under the above Rule will not be enforced except with the consent of a majority of subscribers.

- (2) As regards Out-Patients a charge sufficient to cover the cost of dressings, etc., will be made, the amount to be fixed by the Matron in each individual case.
- 13. In no circumstances will the Managers undertake to pay the Funeral expenses of patients dying in Hospital.
- 14. Patients must obey strictly the instructions of the Superintendent and the Matron in all matters relating to their conduct while in Hospital, and neglect or refusal to do so will render a patient liable to be expelled.

- 15. The Hospital Superintendent will have the control of the X-Ray apparatus and all equipment for Electrical Treatment, and he will be held responsible to the Managers for the proper and efficient management thereof.
- 16. (1) The X-Ray and Electrical Apparatus and Equipment for "light" treatment will be available at the Hospital for in-patients, outpatients, and patients seen by the Surgeon, in his capacity as Consultant (including private practice). The charges payable by patients of these classes will be on the scale set out below.
 - (2) All plates shall remain the property of the Hospital, and shall not be removed from the Hospital, except that by arrangement with the Tuberculosis Joint Committee and the Tuberculosis Officer, plates taken in cases for which the Committee are responsible may be transferred to them for purposes of record; plates will be made available for inspection by the patients' Medical Attendants at the Hospital at all reasonable times.
 - (3) In the X-Ray Department the following fees, which are designed to cover the cost of maintenance and materials, will be charged:—

Photographs 10/6. Screening 10/6.

Prints may be supplied to the patients' Medical Attendants at the discretion of the Hospital Superintendent at charges to cover the cost of material and time.

The foregoing charges may be reduced or waived, according to the circumstances of the patients.

- (4) For the Electrical Treatment the Superintendent will fix the charge to be made in each individual case, bearing in mind such of the foregoing circumstances as may be relevant.
- (5) The Fees provided for in this paragraph shall be paid to the Matron or the Nurse in charge at the time they are incurred.
- (6) These arrangements are provisional and subject to modification in the light of experience.
- 17. Any complaints by patients treated at the Hospital should be made to the Managers through the Secretary within a reasonable time
