TO THE SUBSCRIBERS

FOR YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1931.

The Managers are extremely gratified to be able, notwithstanding the difficulties through which the country has passed and is passing, to report another highly successful year in the administration and running of the Hospital. The running costs again bear favourable comparision with former years. There is still heavy expenditure in connection with the running of the heating and lighting plant. This is a subject to which the Managers are still giving their anxious consideration and it is hoped that further economies will be effected during the current year.

MEDICAL REPORT.

The year under review has again been a strenuous one for the Surgeon and his staff.

At the beginning of the year In-Patients under treatment numbered 25 and there were admitted during the year a total of 542. The discharge numbered 520, deaths 29, leaving under treatment at the end of the year 33. The Out-Patients treated during the year numbered 1392.

The nominal accommodation of the Hospital was again continuously exceeded throughout the period under review. The number of operations performed were 559 compared with 593 the previous year. The average number of patients in Hospital over the year was 25.26. 17 cases were treated in the Macaulay Maternity Wards, these Wards when not in use for maternity cases being used Curing the year for cases which could not be accommodated in the ordinary Wards. It will be seen that there is a

slight drop in the number of operations performed and in the average number of beds occupied during the year. The difference is, however, more apparent than real at there was a diminution of Tonsil cases treated of about 60, and a very large increase in the number of major operations performed entailing longer after care in the Hospital. The Surgical work of a major nature is steadily increasing.

The Managers take this opportunity of tendering their thanks to the Surgeon the Matron, and to the other members of the staff for their very efficient and valuable services so ungrudgingly given.

During the past year the arrangement whereby the local Practitioners have acted in rotation as anaesthetists at the Hospital, has again proved entirely successful and the Managers have to thank Doctors, A. Macrae, C. B. Macleod, A. Macphail, and P. J. Macleod, for this result.

FINANCIAL REPORT

At the commencement of the year there was a credit balance at Maintenance Account of £623 15 9. The total income for the year ended 31st December, 1931 amounted to £5,022 14 4 and the Total Expenditure to £4,975 9 2 showing an excess of Income over Expenditure for the year of £47 5 2. This result is particularly gratifying to the Managers when it is kept in view that Subscriptions and Donations from abroad were, owing to prevaling conditions, more or less negligible. Notwithstanding the fact that part of the Investment Income was not received during the year the total income shows an increase of £60 2 4. Contributions from patients show a very gratifying increase of £195 19 6 and it is hoped that patients during the current year will continue to show their appreciation of the services rendered in this practical fashion.

The income from the Endowment Fund amounted to £1617 !7 1 as compared with £1680 6 6, a decrease of £62 9 5 As stated above the decrease is due to certain Endowment Fund income not having been received during the year. It is anticipated, however, that the income will be paid during the current year.

The receipts for X-Ray treatment are also very gratifying, this account showing a credit balance for the first time since the installation of the Plant.

The expenditure during the year shows a decrease of $£65\ 10\ 4$, the main decrease being on the Provisions and Instruments and Appliances Accounts which show decreases during the year of $£135\ 0\ 7$ and $£106\ 17\ 2$ respectively.

During the year there was expended on Renewals and Repairs to Buildings and Plant a sum of £234 16 5, an increase of £180 4 3 over the previous year.

ENDOWMENT FUND.

During the year sums amounting to £2516 10 1 were received for the Endowment Fund being £1500 on account of the Legacy bequeathed by the late Miss M. A. Macrae, £500 bequeathed by the late Dr. Tolmie for the endowment of a Cot to be called the "Margaret Pringle Tolmie Cot," £322 6 1 being a further payment on account of the Legacy bequeathed by the late Mrs Janet Macrae, and £194 4/- being balance of the Department of Health for Scotland's grant towards the extension scheme at the Hospital.

The sincere thanks of the Managers are due to Mrs Tolmie, Widow of the late Dr. Tolmie, who herself supplied the Cot and its equipment, thereby enabling the Legacy of ± 500 to be invested for the Hospital free of all charges

As stated above the Revenue for the year again compares very favourably with that of previous years, public support particularly at home being exceptionally well maintained, and as mentioned, another gratifying feature being the fact that patients actually treated in the Hospital are showing their appreciation in the most practical way. The need for support is apparent to all thinking people and the Managers look forward with confidence to a continuance, and with improving conditions, an increase in the public support during the current year. In this connection the Managers point out that the Honorary Secretary and one or two of their members will be only too pleased to attend meetings in any district that has not already got a Collecting Association or Committee with a view to the formation of such Committee

The thanks of the Managers are also due to the members of the Local Education Authority for granting permission (subject to the Headmasters' consent) for schools to be used for the holding of Social Gatherings and Concerts for behoof of the Hospital Funds.

The sincere thanks of the Managers are also due to the various local Committees, Collectors, and Organisers of Fleece days etc. for the splendid work done by them in raising funds for the Hospital and also to all the individual contributors who have given donations in money or in kind, all of whom have made another successful year possible.

The thanks of the Managers are also due to the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer for their valued services during the year. They regret to record that owing to illness Mr Macrae ceased to act as Secretary early in May 1931, Mr Williamson acting as Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer from that time.

SURGEON'S ANNUAL REPORT.

It is interesting to note that the total number of patients treated in Hospital is slightly less than in the year 1930 Notwithstanding this fact the demand made upon the Nursing Staff has been greater owing to the relative increase in the number of patients who required major surgical operations.

At the present time there are eighty-six patients on the Waiting List for admission, and, although as far as possible those are admitted in rotation, it is apparent that many have to wait weeks or months before getting their turn owing to the limited number of beds, and bearing in mind the large number of emergency cases which have to be dealt with.

Even although the Hospital is working at its utmost capacity, it is noteworthy that no patient, recommended for admission, or really in need of immediate hospital treatment, has had to be refused.

In conclusion, I wish to convey to the Managers my great appreciation of the services rendered by the Matron and Nursing Staff, who have not only maintained a high standard of nursing, but have, in addition, given up "off-duty" time on many occasions in order that emergency cases might be properly cared for.

CONSTITUTION OF LEWIS HOSPITAL.

As amended by Resolution of Subscribers passed at the Annual Meeting of Subscribers held at Stornoway on the 24th day of March 1932, and approved by the Department of Health on 27th January, 1932.

(1) The Hospital shall be called the Lewis Hospital. It shall be open for the reception of persons from the districts of Lewis and Harris, whether residents or non-residents requiring medical and surgical treatment for accidents and diseases of any kind other than such acute febrile infections as cannot properly be treated in a general Hospital, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations and Bye-laws regulating the administration of the Hospital.

BOARD OF MANAGERS.

(2) A board of Managers shall, save as hereinafter provided, be elected by the Subscribers, as hereinafter defined at the Annual Meeting The Board shall consist of fifteen elected of the Subscribers. members, and until 16th March, 1933, one member nominated by the Department of Health for Scotland, the Provost of the Burgh of Stornoway for the time being, one Lewis member nominated by the County Council of Ross and Cromarty, one Harris member nominated by the County Council of Inverness, the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer ex-officiis Each elected member shall be elected for three years and shall then retire but shall be eligible for re-election. The Board of Managers may at any time co-opt a member to fill a vacancy occurring in the elected members of the Board until the next Annual Meeting of Subscribers. The Subscribers at their Annual Meeting shall elect the number of elected Managers required to complete the constitution of the Board as above laid down. The Hospital funds and property and the whole affairs of the Hospital shall be under the control and management of the Board of Managers., They shall have the charge and oversight of all arrangements for carrying on the work of the Hospital. Five members shall be a quorum. The Managers shall appoint a Chairman who shall hold office for a period of three years, provided he continues to be a member of the of the Board as hereinbefore provided. Rules, Regulations and Bye laws may be made and altered at any time by the Board, provided the same have been approved by the Department of Health for Scotland, and are not contrary to, or inconsistent with, any Regulations made by the Subscribers as hereinafter provided, and provided also that such Rules, Regulations, and Bye-laws shall be submitted to the Subscribers at their next Annual Meeting or at any meeting of the Subscribers which may be called for that purpose; and if not approved by a majority of the Subscribers present and entitled to vote and voting they shall forthwith lapse and cease to be of any force or effect.

The Board of Managers shall have power to appoint a Surgeon-Superintendent, a Secretary, a Treasurer, Medical Officers, a Matron, Nurses, and Servants, and such other persons as they deem necessary for the efficient management of the Hospital, and at such remuneration and on such terms as they think proper, and may on what they consider sufficient cause suspend or dismiss any person employed by them.

The Managers shall lay before the Annual Meeting of the Subscribers a Report on the work, administration, and finance of the Hospital for the preceding financial year. They shall conform in all their actings to any approved Regulations made by the Subscribers as hereinafter provided, but third parties dealing with them or with the Trustees shall not be affected by any failure of the Managers or of the Trustees to conform to such Regulations, but all their dealings and intromissions with third parties shall be as valid and binding as between them and such third parties as if such Regulations had been duly observed.

SUBSCRIBERS.

(3) For the purposes of this Constitution "Subscribers" shall mean and include all persons who have subscribed not less than Ten Shillings to the funds of the Hospital during the financial year ending 31st December, immediately preceding any Meeting of the Subscribers in which they claim to take part and vote and who, in case of dispute, satisfy the Chairman of such Meeting as to their being thus qualified, and in addition thereto:—

The Trustees of the Hospital.

The Members of the Board of Managers.

A Nominee of the Stornoway Pier and Harbour Commission.

A Nominee of the Town Council of Stornoway.

A Lewis member nominated by the County Council of Ross and Cromarty.

A Harris member nominated by the County Council of Inverness. The Ministers of all religious denominations in Lewis and Harris. Every Medical Practitioner and Medical Officer who has been resident and practising or holding office in Lewis or Harris for at least one year and continues to do so, and

Life Subscribers, being any persons who satisfy the Chairman of the Meeting that they have subscribed a total sum of ± 50 to the funds of the Hospital since its inception or a donation of ± 20 at any one time, or who have been elected to be Life Subscribers by any Meeting of the Subscribers.

The Chairman of all Meetings of Subscribers shall be the Sheriff-Substitute at Stornoway, or in his absence some person appointed by the Meeting. The Chairman shall have a deliberative and a casting vote. Ten subscribers shall be a quorum at all Meetings of Subscribers.

Any Meeting of Subscribers may make general Regulations for the conduct of the affairs of the Hospital by the Managers, provided that intimation of the proposed Regulations shall have been made in the Notice calling the Meeting and that they shall be approved by a majority of the Subscribers present and voting at such Meeting, and such Regulations shall remain in force until recalled in like manner, but such Regulations shall not be operative until they have received the approval of the Department of Health for Scotland.

ACCOUNTS.

(4) The Financial Year of the Hospital shall end on 31st December in each year. A Chartered Accountant shall be appointed as Auditor by the Board of Managers at the close of each financial year. The Accounts for the preceding financial year as audited by him shall be submitted to the next Annual Meeting of Subscribers and shall be open to the inspection of any Subscriber at the Office of the Treasurer between the hours of two and four p.m. on the two Fridays next preceding the Annual Meeting, and for this purpose the Treasurer's decision shall be final as to who is qualified as a Subscriber. Notice of the place and hour of inspection shall be given in the Notice calling the Annual Meeting.

MEETINGS

as soon as practicable after the close of each financial year and in any case not later than the month of March following. Other meetings of Subscribers may be called throughout the year at the request of not less than seven Subscribers, qualified as such at the date of the request; and such meetings, as well as any adjournments thereof, shall have the same powers and authority as the Annual Meeting. Meetings of the Subscribers shall be convened in the name of the Secretary by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in Lewis and Harris at least one clear week before the meeting, and, in the case of the Annual Meeting, at least fourteen clear days before the Meeting.

Meetings of the Board of Managers shall be called by circular in name of the Secretary. Ordinary meetings may be held at such times as the Managers may direct, and a meeting shall be called at any time on the request of three Managers.

TRUSTEES.

(6) The whole funds and property of the Hospital, heritable and moveable shall be vested in the Sheriff-Substitute at Stornoway, the Provost of Stornoway, the Lewis Nominee of the County Council of Ross and

Cromarty to the Board of Managers, and the Chairman of the Board of Managers, all for the time being, and their respective successors in office, as Trustees for behoof of the Hospital, two to form a quorum, and all titles to property and investments of funds shall be taken in their names. with power to them to sue or defend all actions affecting the interests of the Hospital. The Trustees shall incur no personal liability in respect of their office or their actings in connection therewith, and they shall be idemnified out of the funds of the Hospital against all costs, charges, losses damages, and expenses which they or any of them may respectively incur or be put to on account of their holding such office, or of their actings as aforesaid, always provided that for any action or process undertaken by them in any Court of Law they shall have obtained the approval and concurrence of the Board of Managers either before or after the commencement of such process. In the event of the death, resignation removal, or disqualification of any Trustee the Subscribers may appoint a Trustee or Trustees to complete the numbers thereof if necessary.

GENERAL.

(7) The foregoing shall for the future be the Constitution of the Hospital and the preceding Constitution so far as differing from the foregoing is hereby abrogated; but any Regulations, Rules, or Bye-laws, and any actings or intromissions duly made or done in conformity with the Constitution, in force at the time shall continue to be of full validity, force, and effect until altered or withdrawn under the powers hereby defined.

Any revision of, or alterations on, the terms of the foregoing Constitution, which may be proposed at any time, shall be submitted to and considered by the Board of Managers, and shall thereafter be submitted for adoption to any meeting of Subscribers. Confirmation of any such revision or alteration must be given by at least two-thirds of the Subscribers present and voting at the meeting and the Constitution shall be held to be so revised or altered as from the date of such confirmation, provided that intimation of the proposed revisions or alterations shall have been given in the Notice calling the meeting, and that they shall have been approved by the Department of Health for Scotland.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

As amended by Resolution passed at the Annual Meeting of Subscribers held on 24th March, 1932 and approved by the Department of Health for Scotland on 27th January, 1932.

- I The Surgeon-Consultant for the time being shall act as Superintendent of the Hospital.
- II The existing Regulations with Reference to the admission, treatment, and conduct of Patients while in the Hospital are rescinded and the following substituted:—
- 1 The Superintendent of the Hospital shall regulate the admission of Patients.
- 2 Patients for whose treatment Local Authorities are responsible will be admitted on the certification of the Authority's Medical Officer of Health.
- 3 Except in cases of accident or sudden emergency, application for admission of private individuals must be made (on prescribed form) by, or with the express consent of, the Patient's usual Medical Attendant.
- 4 In cases of accident or sudden emergency, the Superintendent may authorise instant admission without reference to any private Medical Practitioner.
- 5 Patients suffering from such acute febrile infections or such other physical or mental diseases as cannot properly be treated in a general hospital will not be admitted; and cases of chronic diseases of long standing, or of incurable diseases, will be admitted only under special circumstances.
- 6 All treatment in surgical cases will be provided by the Surgeon-Superintendent. In medical cases treatment will be provided by the patient's own medical attendant or his nominee such nomination to be intimated on admission to the Superintendent.
- 7 In cases for whose treatment the Surgeon has assumed responsibility he shall afford to the Patient's usual Medical Attendant every facility for collaborating with him in the treatment of the case.
- 8 So far as Consultations at the Hospital are concerned, the Surgeon will confine himself to those cases which are surgical, and all such consultations must be with the consent of the Patient's own Medical Attendant.
- 9 No charge will be made for Surgical or Medical treatment provided at the Hospital except in cases sent in by Local Authorities and patients from foreign ships

- 10 The Fees payable to the Surgeon in respect of patients for whose treatment a Local Authority is liable shall be arranged between the Managers, the Surgeon, and the local Authority concerned.
- .11 (1) It shall be the duty of the Surgeon in co-operation with the Managers to arrange for the services of an Anaesthetist where such are required in connection with any case treated by him, and, when necessary, for a Practitioner to assist him at his operation.
- (2) A fee of 10/6 shall be payable by the Managers to an Anaesthetist employed by the Surgeon.
- 12 (1) Normally no charge will be made for maintenance while in Hospital, but in exceptional cases where the Managers are satisfied as to ability to pay, a charge not exceeding £3 per week may be made, and in Surgical cases a charge may also be made to cover cost of dressings. One half of the maternity benefit obtained by insured patients and the wives of insured men must be paid to the Hospital.
- Note Payment of any charges made under the above Rule will not be enforced except with the consent of a majority of subscribers.
- (2) As regards Out-Patients a charge sufficient to cover the cost of dressings etc., will be made, the amount to be fixed by the Matron in each individual case.
- 13 In no circumstances will the Managers undertake to pay the Funeral Expenses of Patients dying in the Hospital.
- 14 Patients must obey strictly the instructions of the Superintendent and the Matron in all matters relating to their conduct while in Hospital, and neglect or refusal to do so will render a Patient liable to be expelled.
- 15 The Hospital Superintendent will have the control of the X-Ray apparatus and all equipment for Electrical Treatment, and he will be held responsible to the Managers for the proper and efficient management thereof.
- 16 (1) The X-Ray and electrical apparatus and equipment for "light" treatment will be available at the Hospital for in-patients, outpatients and patients seen by the Surgeon in his capacity as Consultant (including private practice). The charges payable by patients of all these classes will be on the scale set out below
- (2) All plates shall remain the property of the Hospital, and shall not be removed from the Hospital, except that by arrangement with the Tuberculosis Joint Committee and the Tuberculosis Officer. Plates taken in cases for which the Committee are responsible may be transferred to them for purposes of record, plates will be made available for inspection by the Patients' medical attendants at the Hospital at all reasonable times.

(3) In the X-Ray Department, the following fees, which are designed to cover the cost of maintenance and materials, will be charged:—

Screening - - 10/6

Photographs 10/6 to £.1 1/-

The amount to be charged in each individual case to be fixed by the Superintendent with regard to the quantity of current used, wear and tear of coil and tubes, and the cost of sensitive materials used.

Prints may be supplied to the patients' medical attendant's at the discretion of the Hospital Superintendent at charges to cover the cost of material and time.

The foregoing charges may be reduce or waived, according to the circumstances of the patients.

- (4) For the Electrical Treatment, the Superintendent will fix the charge to be made in each individual case, bearing in mind such of the foregoing circumstances as may be relevent.
- (5) The Fees provided for in this paragraph shall be paid to the Matron or the Nurse in charge at the time they are incurred.
- (6) These arrangements are provisional and subject to modification in the light of experience.
- 17 Any complaints by patients treated at the Hospital should be made to the Managers through the Secretary within a reasonable time.
