	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. This Joint Health Protection Plan (JHPP) is the most recent iteration of the requirement to have a joint health protection plan across statutory agencies. It provides an overview of health protection (communicable disease and environmental health) priorities, provision and preparedness for NHS Western Isles (NHSWI) and Comhairle nan Eilean Siar (CNES) as required by the Public Health etc (Scotland) Act 2008¹. 2. The JHPP has been prepared in collaboration with Comhairle nan Eilean Siar, and aims to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • provide an overview of health protection priorities, provision and preparedness • outline the joint arrangements which NHSWI and CNES have in place for the protection of public health • improve the level of preparedness to respond effectively to a health protection incident and emergency • highlight priorities identified for the period of the plan • identify the resources which are required to meet the plan • detail liaison arrangements between NHSWI, CNES and other agencies • develop learning across all agencies
