It highlights the achievements of the work in line with Government objectives, in particular in relation to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • staff health, noting the introduction of the EASY staff absence management system, and the availability and uptake of flu immunisation • healthy eating, supporting both healthy living choices for catering services across the Health Board, and in supporting staff to maintain healthy weight • breastfeeding, providing peer support and companionship for breast-feeding mums • physical activity, setting out the achievements of the physical activity challenges and walk groups • health behaviour change, using a blend of e-learning and face-to-face training • patient centred healthcare, with significant savings in carbon emissions beginning to be realised through use of telehealth and reductions in the
