

What is a Community Nurse?

A nurse is someone:

- who provides care in the patient's own home or care setting (not in acute hospital).
- who strives to allow the patient to be cared for at home (if able).
- who focuses not just on the task they are required to do but on their patient, the patient's family and other aspects of the patient's life.


