Hospital at **Home Service**



Information for patients and carers

Based on your recent assessment, you have been assessed as being suitable to be cared for using the Hospital at Home service in your usual home setting.

Hospital at Home service

The Hospital at Home service is short-term care based in your own home or in a care home setting.

It delivers therapies which usually would have required you to be an inpatient in a hospital setting.

Patients are admitted into the service after being assessed by clinical Consultants at the Western Isles Hospital, and found to be appropriate for this arrangement.

Whilst you are receiving the Hospital at Home service, you will remain under the care of your Consultant - the same as if you were a hospital inpatient.

You will have a personalised treatment plan when you enter the Hospital at Home service. Your Hospital Care Team will explain this to you.

Health professionals will also regularly visit your home during the course of your treatment to offer health care and support.

Treatments offered

The following are some of the types of treatment that patients can expect to receive from the Hospital at Home service:

Oxygen Therapy

If appropriate, Oxygen Therapy will be provided using a portable device (an oxygen concentrator) which can enable you to remain in your usual residence.

Patients who receive oxygen in this way will have been assessed to establish the amount of oxygen they require, and will have regular monitoring of their oxygen requirements as defined by the Consultant in charge.

The IGo2 concentrator has no storage tank, but rather converts air into pure Oxygen so the device remains lightweight and portable.



Antibiotic and Fluids

If appropriate, you will be able to receive fluids and antibiotics into a drip in your arm.

This will be co-ordinated by the care team who will keep a careful eye on your pulse, blood pressure, blood tests and the drip site.

This will continue for as long as the teams think it is providing benefit.



Routine observations

This includes:

- blood pressure
- temperature
- pulse
- oxygen levels
- blood test
