Wound care instructions

- Ensure that hands are thoroughly washed before any change of dressings
- Keep wound dressing dry and intact
- Do not remove dressing for at least 48 hours unless heavily soiled or wet
- Keep wound dressings dry when showering or bathing
- Do not touch wound.

Should you notice any of the following, seek MEDICAL ADVICE from your GP, Practice Nurse, Community Nurse, or NHS 24 (tel. 111). Out-of-hours please contact NHS 24 on 111.

- redness around the wound site
- notice any discharge from wound
- any odour/smell from wound
- have any new pain around wound site
- develop a temperature, or feel shivery and unwell.
