## Know the facts



Aneurysm Size	Group 1 Driving Licence	Group 2 Driving Licence (Bus, Lorry and Taxi)
Less than 5.5cm	May drive and need not notify DVLA.	May drive. <b>Must notify DVLA.</b>
5.5cm to 5.9cm	May drive and need not notify DVLA.	Must not drive. <b>Must notify DVLA.</b>

Aneurysm Size	Group 1 Driving Licence	Group 2 Driving Licence (Bus, Lorry and Taxi)
6cm to 6.4cm	May drive. <b>Must notify DVLA.</b>	Must not drive. <b>Must notify DVLA.</b>
6.5cm or greater	Must not drive. <b>Must notify DVLA.</b>	Must not drive. <b>Must notify DVLA.</b>
