Who we are and about our new law



We are **NHS Scotland**. We want to tell you about the Scottish Government's new **law** about smoking.



Laws are rules made by the **government**. The **government** is in charge of running the country.



From **5 September 2022** it will be **illegal** to smoke within 15 metres of a hospital building.



Illegal means that by law you aren't allowed to do something.



If you smoke within 15 meters of a hospital building you will be asked to stop and might be given either



a penalty notice of £50. A
penalty notice is a warning to
stop you from doing something
you shouldn't.



 or a fine of up to £1,000. A fine is money you have to pay because you did something you shouldn't.



Hospitals are places where health is important and **second hand smoke** is bad for people's health.



Second hand smoke is when you smoke and someone near you breathes it in even if they aren't smoking.
