NHS Western Isles wishes to offer sincere sympathy on your bereavement. We hope this leaflet will be of help to you with some of the practical issues that you face in relation to your loss.

Medical Certificate

After a death, a GP or hospital consultant is required to sign the Medical Certificate of Cause of Death (Form 11) (more commonly known as the death certificate). Once signed, the death certificate will be emailed directly to the Registrar.

Registering the death

On receipt of the death certificate, the Registrar will contact the next of kin to assist with completing the Certificate of Registration of Death (Form 14).

On completion, the Registrar will give the next of kin:

- a completed Certificate of Registration of Death (Form 14)
- Form 334/S1 for use to inform Social Security and National Insurance of the death, where necessary
- if desired (and on payment of an additional fee), an extract of the entry recorded in the Register of Deaths can be purchased for use to notify the death to insurance companies, banks, building societies, etc.

Safe disposal of medications

To dispose of any unwanted prescribed medications or healthcare products, please do not flush or bin these items, but return them to your GP Practice or local pharmacy for safe disposal.

If you have difficulty in returning these items, please contact your local Community Nursing Service who may be able to arrange uplift. Contact 01851 763306 (Lewis and Harris) or 01870 605138/602266 (Uist and Barra).

Medical equipment return

In the event that medical equipment requires to be returned to NHS Western Isles, a member of healthcare staff will be in contact, usually after the funeral has been held.

However, should you prefer items to be removed sooner, please do not hesitate to contact the Community Equipment Service team. Contact 01851 703054 (Lewis and Harris) or 01870 603648 (Uist and Barra) to request equipment uplift.

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Sanctuary Space

There is a Sanctuary Space both within the Western Isles Hospital and Uist & Barra Hospital and anyone is welcome to drop in and spend time there.

You may find the Sanctuary Space beneficial if you are looking for a quiet space, a place for reflection, or a time for prayer. Various reading materials and religious items are available for you to use, if you would find them helpful.

An NHS Healthcare Chaplain is always on-call and hospital ward or reception staff can arrange for them to be paged on request.

Alternatively you may choose to register the death at any Registration Office in Scotland. Please contact the appropriate office direct to confirm their opening hours and arrange an appointment.

Please note
The funeral cannot take place until after the death has been registered.

Organising the funeral

After the death has been confirmed by the GP or community nurse, the next of kin (or their representative) should contact the undertaker to inform them of the death and the family's wish in relation to the funeral.

It would be helpful at the initial contact if you knew the following:

- the person's full name and date of birth, (for women, if applicable, her maiden name is also needed)
- · when and where you wish the funeral to take place
- · what form you wish the funeral to take.

You may also wish to consider whether or not to have flowers/ wreaths, or make donations to a preferred charity.
