1 Purpose

2 Report summary

2.1 Situation

The Western Isles Integration Scheme was submitted to Scottish Government and approved by Scottish parliament on 21st September 2015. There is a requirement to review the scheme in line with the conditions set out in Section 44 of the Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014.

The Act requires that the local authority and Health Board carry out the review.

A full review of the integration scheme has been undertaken with detailed consideration form Comhairle nan Eilean Siar and NHS Western Isle. A revised Integration Scheme was considered by a special meeting of the Board on April 18 2024. The Board was unable to reach a decision on the revisions proposed at that time.

The Act requires that the local authority and Health Board carry out the review.

2.2 Background

Given the requirement to review the scheme and in recognition of the context outlined regarding the impact of global pandemic and subsequent review the Board was content with the delay in the review.

The review will consider and advise on any changes required to the overall Scope, Local Governance arrangements and functions delegated in the Integration Scheme and advise on our consultation strategy. Consultation is primarily with CnES and NHW WI are not to be confused with wider public consultation which is not required.

Given the outcome of the previous review a new Integration Scheme has been drafted from the ground up, collaboratively by NHS WI and CnES. The Scheme covers the full range of requirements, namely:

- 1. Governance Arrangements
- 2. Delegation of Functions
- 3. Local Operational Delivery Arrangements
- 4. Chief Officer
- 5. Workforce
- 6. Finance
- 7. Participation and Engagement
- 8. Complaints
- 9. Risk management
- 10. Dispute resolution mechanism

2.3 Assessment

Given the feedback considered by the Board alongside opinions expressed the Board requested that the main partners undertake a further review of the Scheme as outlined in The Act.

A new Scheme of Integration is now in draft and will be progress through local governance structure and be presented to the Board at the March 2025 series. Scottish Government officials have been briefed (in line with legislation). Subject to approval by the Board the Integration Scheme will be presented to Scottish Ministers for consideration and approval.
