Information and advice on the Dermatology Liaison Nurse Service in the Western Isles

This leaflet explains some of the ways in which the Dermatology Liaison Nurse Service can help with your skin condition.

About the service

The Dermatology Liaison Nurse Service was developed to support those in the Western Isles with skin conditions.

Regular clinics are held in the Outpatient Department at Western Isles Hospital in Stornoway. Our clinics are mainly face-toface, but we also offer the option of videolinked clinics using 'NHS Near Me'.

The Service offers, in addition to a Dermatology Liaison Nurse, a Consultant from Raigmore Hospital, who attends clinics once every two months.

Assistance to the clinics is also provided by GPs who have undertaken specialist dermatology training.

What does the service offer?

The Dermatology Liaison Nurse Service offers the following treatments:

- Liquid Nitrogen Cryotherapy
- Phototherapy
- Iontophoresis
- Wet Wraps/Impregnated Bandaging
- Topical Treatments
- · Daylight Photodynamic Therapy.

You may also be referred for further investigations such as:

- · wig/hair piece provision
- continued support, advice and education to enhance your prescribed treatment.

How can I attend?

If you require specialist advice/treatment you will be referred to the Service by your own GP for follow up treatment or support.

If you already have received a diagnosis from your GP you can self-refer to the Dermatology Liaison Nurse for further assistance.

The Nurse will see patients:

- at a clinic held at the Outpatients
 Department in Western Isles Hospital.
- who are in-patients (those currently staying) in Western Isles Hospital.
- who are staying in care homes.
- · within their own home, if required.

Contact the Dermatology Liaison Nurse

You can contact the Dermatology Liaison Nurse if you have any concerns or:

- would like information about your skin condition
- have a question about your treatment
- are concerned about your symptoms
- need advice about your medication
- if you need further advice/support.
