Aneurysm Size	Group 1 Driving Licence	Group 2 Driving Licence (Bus, Lorry and Taxi)
Less than 5.5cm	May drive and need not notify DVLA.	May drive. Must notify DVLA.
5.5cm to 5.9cm	May drive and need not notify DVLA.	Must not drive. Must notify DVLA.

Aneurysm Size	Group 1 Driving Licence	Group 2 Driving Licence (Bus, Lorry and Taxi)
6cm to 6.4cm	May drive. Must notify DVLA.	Must not drive. Must notify DVLA.
6.5cm or greater	Must not drive. Must notify DVLA.	Must not drive. Must notify DVLA.
